
STANDING ORDER

Warrant Walk-In Procedure During Pandemic
(Misdemeanor and Gross Misdemeanor Warrants Only)

Numerous warrants have been issued with a limited ability to address them due to the impact of the COVID-19 health pandemic on court appearances and jail accommodations. Becker County District Court has created a one-time temporary process for certain eligible case types to allow an individual to walk into the courthouse to address their warrant without being arrested. **Therefore, the following process is approved, adopted, and Ordered:**

1. If you have a warrant on a misdemeanor or gross misdemeanor offense (except those case types noted below*):
 - **One Time, Tuesdays, Wednesdays or Thursdays from 3-4 pm**, you can walk into the Becker County Courthouse to Court Administration; **you will:**
 - update your contact information, and
 - sign for a new court date;
 - your previous release conditions will be reinstated (you will get a copy).

* *This Order does not apply to:*

- Driving While Impaired
- Order for Protection Violations
- Harassment Restraining Order Violations
- 5th Degree Assault
- Domestic Assault
- Interference with Privacy
- Indecent Exposure
- Domestic Abuse No Contact Order Violations

2. If bail or bond was forfeited, it will be reinstated.
