

Because the bid for the Bikeway was so much higher than the estimate for the States approval the County needs to find ways to lower the cost to the State for this project. Mr. Heyer suggested a possible way of reducing the construction cost would be for the County to take on some of the phases of construction and alternate bridge construction. The Board requested Mr. Heyer to research this project further.

Mr. Heyer reported, the grading on CSAH 13, north mile, was almost completed.

A complaint had been received from a resident on CSAH 5. Mr. Heyer researched the complaint and according to the Maintenance Manual 5-791.135 PRIVATE ENTRANCES Becker County is not obligated to do maintenance or repair in this instance.

After some discussion Krueger moved, seconded by Danielson, to pay Roger Lundberg \$5.50 per hour for work done in ditch obstruction removal. Motion carried.

The Big Cormorant Lake outlet was discussed.

Loren Danielson, Robert Krueger and Dave Heyer as a committee, reported to the County Board, that a draft of the procedure for redetermination of benefits has been sent to the County Attorney for his legal opinion. If this procedure is adopted, Becker County will hire three (3) viewers to redetermine benefits on County Ditches. The viewers would be Becker County residents recommended by the Northwest Viewers Association.

On motion the Board adjourned until 1:00 O'Clock P.M.

BECKER COUNTY ORDINANCE NUMBER NINE

The County Board of Becker County ordains:

That the holder of an on-sale wine license issued pursuant to Minn. Stat. 340A.404 Subd. 5(a) who is also licensed to sell non-intoxicating malt liquors at on-sale pursuant to Minn. Stat. Section 340A.411, and whose gross receipts are at least sixty percent (60%) attributable to the sale of food, is hereby authorized to sell intoxicating malt liquors at on-sale without an additional license. This ordinance applies only to persons who hold both an on-sale wine license and an on-sale non-intoxicating malt liquor license on August 1, 1987.

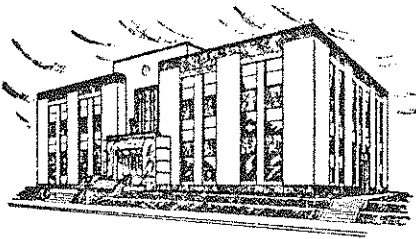

BECKER COUNTY ORDINANCE NUMBER NINE

The County Board of Becker County ordains:

That the ordinance authorizing certain persons to sell intoxicating malt liquors on-sale without an additional license which was adopted on the 21st day of July, 1987 is hereby amended to read as follows:

That the holder of an on-sale wine license issued pursuant to Minn. Stat. 340A.404 Subd. 5(a) who is also licensed to sell non-intoxicating malt liquors at on-sale pursuant to Minn. Stat. Section 340A.411, and whose gross receipts are at least sixty percent (60%) attributable to the sale of food, is hereby authorized to sell intoxicating malt liquors at on-sale without an additional license.


